

At the center, staff provide forensic interviews, forensic medical exams, trauma focused - cognitive behavioral therapy, and other victim services including education and advocacy. CAC coordinates the



Anderson County Child Protective Investigative Team and are trained in diversity, inclusion, and equity for all clients. ORUUC's support of the Child Advocacy Center has helped many children heal and recover from traumatic abuse, thus supporting the dignity and worth of each child served. Voting on April 28, 2024

Candidating Week will end with a congregational meeting and vote immediately after the service on April 28 at 11:30 to vote on calling Lóre as our settled minister. Please make every effort to attend this meeting since we need a quorum of 25% of all members. As we take the next big step in the history of Oak Ridge Unitarian Universalist Church, it is critical to hear from every voice and for all to participate in this process. 85% of voting members must vote YES to Lóre as our next settled minister. Note: According to ORUUC bylaws, special elections are IN PERSON voting ONLY with NO proxies allowed. This means that members must be PHYSICALLY PRESENT at church in order to cast your vote. We will be broadcasting the vote on Zoom, but no virtual votes will be taken or counted. Wine and Winds Saturday, June 1 at 3:30 p.m. at ORUUC



Karen Toucey Wilson (June 28, 1944 - April 14, 2024)



Karen Toucey Wilson, 79, of Fairfax, Virginia, passed away on April 14, 2024. She was born on June 28, 1944, in Oak Ridge, Tennessee. She graduated from Oak Ridge High School in 1962, and obtained a Bachelor's degree from Emory University and a Master's degree from the University of North Carolina Chapel Hill.

A service to honor Karen's life will be held at the Oak Ridge Unitarian Universalist Church the morning of May 17, 2024.

While at UNC, Karen met John Wilson, and they married on August 26, 1967. Sons Scott and Brian were born in 1970 and 1973. John's career in the U.S. Navy led them to live all over the world, including Misawa, Japan and Midway Island. When John retired from the Navy in 1982, the family moved to Oak Ridge, where Karen was a research librarian at the Oak Ridge National Laboratory until her retirement in 2005.

Upon her retirement, Karen moved to northern Virginia to be closer to her family, and was very devoted to her granddaughters, giving them piano lessons, watching them after school, and attending many functions and events.

Karen was also a loyal friend, maintaining lifelong relationships with her Toucey and Keelor cousins, high school "Penguins," and college sorority sisters and friends. In her free time, Karen enjoyed reading, gardening, and painting.


